Golf Course Issues and Answers

Annual Bluegrass Control - Plan B

Each spring during the month of May, you may notice some small white circles on our greens which are spots of the weed, annual bluegrass (Poa annua). Those plants germinate in the fall and by the next spring begin spreading prodigious amounts of white seed heads. If left unchecked, over a period of many years, that plant can completely take over the existing bentgrass. Most older golf courses in the Met area are comprised of primarily annual bluegrass, which can make a decent putting surface, but requires many more inputs compared to bent; things such as more water, fungicides, insecticides and fertilizer. Poa greens are also at risk of damage from excessive heat in the summer and ice damage during winter.



When we regrassed our putting greens to bentgrass 7 years ago we knew that the biggest challenge would be keeping them free of annual bluegrass. At the time there was a very promising new herbicide (PoaCure) which was on the market in Korea and was in the the testing phase in the United States. All of the original research had shown that it was the safest and most effective control product for eliminating annual bluegrass from bentgrass greens that had ever been discovered. We also did a lot of the testing right here in our own nursery.

Annual Bluegrass Control - Plan B

Original expectations for its approval from the EPA began in 2015, which didn't happen, then it was 2016, again a swing and a miss, and now mid 2017. With what appears to be suspicious delays, it is possible that that product, as good as it is, doesn't ever receive an EPA registration. So we have had to put other methodologies in place to help combat the encroachment of annual bluegrass.

There are a number of products that we can use to fight this battle which all have benefits toward our cause, but also have side effects. So our decision making process includes weighing the effectiveness of a product against it's potential negative impacts on the greens. I have experience with a number of herbicides and plant growth regulators and contacts with some of the best turfgrass weed scientists in the world that can help us to be successful.

We need to use a product that will kill or inhibit the existing plants and another one that will stop its germination each fall. It is the constant seeding and germination of the Poa plants that makes it so tough to stop it's establishment.

Our current program involves a plant growth regulator called Cutless, which was the first of it's kind, invented by the Dow company in the early 1980's. The original research was done right here at Stanwich. I actually traveled around the U.S and Japan giving presentations about how to use that wonderful new product in the war against annual bluegrass. It has a very marked growth regulating effect on the annual blue and much less so on the bent, giving bentgrass a competitive advantage. The Cutless also helps to create a more dense compact plant, improves wear tolerance, suppresses dollar spot disease and improves drought hardiness.

To stop the germination of new Poa plants during the fall of the year, we will apply a preemergent herbicide beginning in late summer. This pre and post emergent approach should keep our annual bluegrass populations at minimal levels for the foreseeable future, whether the PoaCure product makes it or not.

Welcome back for yet another action packed summer at the Stanwich pool.

As a staff, our number one priority is the safety of our membership. In order to help us better serve you, we would greatly appreciate it if you could please take a moment to review or rules and regulations with your children. Thank you for your time and support, and we look forward to seeing you all very soon!

Swimming Pool Rules

- -Parents must accompany children in the pool until they are able to swim one length of the pool (25 meters) unassisted with relative ease.
- *The lifeguard on duty has the right to assess any swimmer they feel may not meet these criteria*
- -All personal floatation devices must be approved by the pool manager.
- -All children who are not fully toilet trained must wear a swim diaper while swimming in either pool
 - -Hanging on the basketball hoop and/or lane lines is not permitted
 - -No rough play in or around the pool
 - -Running is not permitted on the pool deck
- -Food and beverages are only to be consumed in the designated table areas
 - *This includes small snacks such as cereal, goldfish, candy etc.*
 - -Pool staff does not guard the baby pool and playground areas and children must be accompanied by an adult at all times when in these areas
 - -Lap lanes are reserved for lap swimming only

Please remind all babysitters and guests of these rules.

Diving Well Rules

- -All swimming pool rules apply to the diving area
- -Floatation devices are not permitted in the diving well unless under the instruction of the

diving coach and his staff

- -Only one bounce while on the diving board
- -Running is strictly prohibited on the diving board
- -While waiting to use the board, divers must wait at the bottom of the ladder
- -All divers must jump/dive straight out and away from the diving board
- -After diving off the board, all divers must **immediately** exit the diving well area using the ladder
 - -The lifeguards reserve the right to prohibit any dive they feel to be unsafe
- -Swimmers may not enter the diving well through the water
- -Absolutely no swimming allowed in the diving well unless the lifeguard on duty has closed both boards
