

### REMINDER

#### **DRESS CODE**

Stanwich is a family club whose members wish to preserve an environment of courtesy, mutual respect and good taste. Please help us achieve that common goal.

**CLUBHOUSE**: Members and their guests are expected to wear appropriate attire in the Clubhouse at all times. Jackets are required in the Main Dining Room for dinner. Casual dress is permitted in the Grill Room and on the Terrace. However, men are required to wear collared shirts which must always be tucked in, and jeans of any type are not permitted, except for ladies white jeans.

Adults and juniors, should remove their hats in the Clubhouse and on the terrace under the awning.

Jeans, cargo pants or shorts, tee shirts without collars, shirts untucked, and baseball caps worn backwards are not permitted anywhere at any time on the Club grounds. Sweat pants and athletic pants are only to be worn in connection with tennis and paddle tennis activity.

GOLF: Proper golf attire is to be worn at all times on the golf course as well as on the practice areas and the putting greens. Men are required to wear pants or Bermuda length shorts as well as collared shirts. Turtleneck shirts are permitted in colder weather. Ladies are required to wear pants or Bermuda length shorts or skirts and appropriate golf shirts. Tennis shorts, short shorts, cargo pants or shorts, jeans and bare midriffs are not permitted. Men's shirts must be tucked in at all times including on the practice areas.

**TENNIS**: All players, juniors and adults, must wear white tennis attire. Some colored trim is permitted. White tennis shoes are required. Footwear with heels or ribbed bottoms is not permitted.

#### **ELECTRONIC DEVICE POLICY**

THE USE OF ELECTRONIC COMMUNICATION DEVICES FOR VOICE COMMUNICATIONS IS PROHIBITED ON THE STANWICH CLUB PROPERTY, including the clubhouse, terrace, tennis house and courts, pool area, golf course and prof shop. You may use your cell phone or other electronic communications devices for voice communications only inside your vehicle and inside the staircase phone booth in the clubhouse. Please make your children, nannies and guests aware of this policy. Physicians, however, may use such devices as required by their medical practice.

The use of electronic devices for the purpose of sending or viewing <u>email or text messages is permitted only in the locker rooms of the clubhouse, pool and tennis house.</u> Use of the camera function of any electronic device is prohibited in areas where Members would expect privacy. Electronic book reading devices may be used at the Club. All devices must be set to silent or vibrate mode when used in these designated areas.

There will be a one week suspension of Member privileges for each offense; notwithstanding the foregoing, in the event of multiple violations or blatant disregard of this policy, a Member may be requested to meet with the Executive Committee, and the Board of Directors may impose additional penalties recommended by the Executive Committee.

The staff is authorized by the Board of Directors to enforce these rules and other policies of the Club.

# Celebrate the Summer with Chardonnay!

We are featuring several new wines on our By-The-Glass program, including a two new Chardonnays. (There are several other additions as well, including a new Rosé Wine, the return of the Vinho Verde, and a new high-end Bordeaux Wine.)

As summer approaches, we can explore the wonderful world of California Chardonnays, with new selections from both Napa and Sonoma. While both wines are California Chardonnays, they are both very different expressions of the same grape, due to the terroir and the amount of time each spends in new and old oak barrels.

The first of these is a familiar name, the Chalk Hill Chardonnay, from the north eastern part of the Sonoma coast. This beautiful medium-golden colored wine has clean, ripe flavors, with expressive fruit aromas of yellow apple and lemon curd, as well as notes of toasted hazelnut, vanilla and crème brulee. This wine has some minerality and rich, textual body, balanced with the perfect amount of acidity expressed in lemon zest and grapefruit notes. The overall flavors, however, stay within the golden-delicious apple and peach cobbler range.

The second of the new Chardonnays is the Napa Cellars Chardonnay. This wine features typical Chardonnay "baking" aromas, of spice and apple crisp, alongside with notes of ripe pear, lemon, green apple and just a touch of pineapple. The Napa Cellars consists of a creamy palate, with butterscotch, pear, and crème fraiche, with integrated notes of toasted oak. This soft, creamy wine has a beautifully balanced acidity, and just a hint of baking-spice notes like clove and anise to round it out.

### **CHEF KINGS COURT**

#### Stanwich Herb Garden

Chef Richard King and Scott Niven, Greens Superintendent, are collaborating on planting the Stanwich Herb Garden which will be located within the Camp Building grounds. Plants will be selected and utilized in both dining menus as well as specialty cocktails. Rosemary, mint, thyme, oregano, basil, cilantro and chives are just a few of the herb garden favorites. A strawberry patch will also be introduced.

The rosemary, once established, will be featured in the "La Dolce Vita" which consists of fresh strawberry and rosemary shrub, white balsamic vinegar and finished with Prosecco and a sprig of fresh rosemary.

The "13th Green", a blend of vodka, cucumber, elderflower, ginger beer and our home grown fresh mint is destined to be another summer favorite.

The herbs will also be harvested and utilized by our own Stanwich campers in Chef King's cooking class this summer.

# Golf Course Issues and Answers

### Best Management Practices for Golf Courses

The states of Virginia, and most recently New York, have done an excellent job establishing a working format that includes a very comprehensive list of the "best management practices" for golf courses. It is likely that all of the Northeastern states, including Connecticut, will also adopt a similar document for their courses before too long. I like to think that we already do an excellent job of protecting our beautiful Stanwich property, its water and wildlife; however, there is always room for improvement. To be sure we are up on the latest, we plan to get familiar with the New York BMPs, and when Connecticut gets on board, those as well.



Golf courses rely on a healthy environment and it is of paramount importance to enhance and protect water quality. A significant body of research exists that indicates successful implementation of BMPs virtually eliminates the golf course risk to water quality. In fact, several studies have shown that implementing BMPs enhances water quality on its journey on and through the golf course property. Each year many billions of gallons of water flow through the Stanwich course via the Horseneck Brook which meanders from North to South among many of our golf holes. As expected, our past testing of the water quality showed it to be improved as it exits the property.

# Golf Course Issues and Answers

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### Best Management Practices for Golf Courses

BMPs are methods or techniques found to be the most effective and practical means of achieving an objective, such as preventing water pollution or reducing pesticide usage. This new guidance provides information for using BMPs to prevent or minimize the effects of golf course management on surface and groundwater to insure and enhance public health and environmental quality. Pollution prevention is easier, less expensive, and more effective than addressing problems "downstream". Essentially, BMPs are a sustainable approach to providing environmental, economic and social benefits to golf and society.

BMPs provide a science-based approach to protecting water quality from potential risks. Whether managing or renovating an existing course, or constructing a new one. For example, golf course renovation and design projects can incorporate landscape BMPs such as vegetated swales, properly sited maintenance and storage facilities and efficiently designed irrigation systems. Specifically, during a renovation or grow-in period, BMPs protect water quality while the site is most vulnerable to soil erosion. A recent example of erosion control during a major renovation was in place for the construction of our new grounds maintenance building (GMB). For existing courses, the day-to-day management decisions on when, how much and how to apply nutrients provides many additional opportunities to apply BMPs that preserves and protects water quality.

BMPs for irrigation and nutrient management and the role of turf density, integrated pest management (IPM) and pesticide management will prevent runoff, leaching, and drift. Golf course managers must understand how much water is needed and when to apply it; how to select fertilizers and pesticides; and when, how, and where these compounds should and should not be applied. In addition, IPM principles provide alternatives to applying pesticides, as well as justification for using pesticides when necessary. Finally, maintenance facilities should also be properly managed in order to prevent point source release of chemicals that can reach ground or surface waters. Our new GMB is well outfitted with devices that help us to avoid sending any chemicals, fertilizers or petroleum products downstream. Additional incentives for implementing BMPs at Stanwich include cost savings associated with applying less fertilizer and pesticides and recognition by the community as being environmental stewards. At this point in time, participation in the BMPs is voluntary, however that may change in the future.
