New Cocktails & Wines



We are working hard on our cocktail and wine program at Stanwich to span both the classic and the innovative. In order to offer a premium cocktail program, we had to begin with some basics - changing our orange and grapefruit juices, ensuring we have fresh lime and lemon juice at the bar, and updating our drink recipes to ensure consistency while using the best quality products, served in a manner to optimize flavor and freshness.

To start, we updated all our mixers at the bar, including new fruit juices and purees, garnishes such as cocktail and maraschino cherries from "Filthy Foods" and home-made sour-mix and simple syrup. The perfect cocktail to highlight these changes is **The Bramble**, which is new to our Cocktail List. The original Bramble was created in London, at Fred's Club in Soho, and was made with dry gin, lemon juice, simple syrup and Crème de Mure. Our version incorporates fresh local fruit, as we muddle summer blackberries with house lemonade and then add Beefeater Gin as a nod to the drinks London origins. The perfect combination of tart, sweet, fruity and herbaceous flavors makes this drink wonderfully balanced, and evocative of summer in every way.

Golf Course Issues and Answers

A Golfers Duty - Care for the Course



In the Rules of Golf book, the first section is entitled Etiquette ; Behavior on the Course. This section provides guidelines on the manner in which the game of golf should be played. If they are followed, all players will gain maximum enjoyment from the game. The overriding principle is that consideration should be shown to others on the course at all times. That consideration also carries over to your care of the golf course, for all those playing behind you want the golf course in perfect condition for their game as well. As a busy day begins at Stanwich, the golf course starts off in near perfect condition and in a

perfect world, it would still be that way by the time the last player completed his round.

Obviously that is not going to happen, but if all the players on any given day do their best to repair their damage to the course as they play around this great track, everyone will have an enjoyable day - at least as far as course conditions are concerned.

The Stanwich golf course is as busy as it has ever been and the summer months are our most busy time of year, so it becomes extra important that all players do their part in care for the course to avoid excess wear that would take away from its quality and the enjoyment of everyone's round. Following is a list of the most important duties that you are responsible for each time you play:

Greens - Ball Mark Repair

When your ball lands on the green - first you must **Search** for your ball mark and then repair it.

Using a tee or ball mark repair tool, clasp it between your thumb and index finger and then using the knuckles of your four other fingers as a fulcrum, beginning at the back of the ball mark, pry the compressed turf back into its original place and then using your putter **tamp the repaired spot level with the surface**. There is no need to poke any unnecessary holes around the edges of the ball mark and when you are done there shouldn't be any soil showing, ie: **the spot should be entirely green again**.



Footwork

Your golf spikes should not create any scuff marks on the greens that may affect other player's putts for the rest of that day. If you do inadvertently make a scuff mark, **tap it down and after putting out, all golfers should tap down any spike marks you see around the hole**.

When buying new shoes, try to get a pair that will be the least abrasive to the turf and if you already own shoes with very aggressive spikes, please ask the golf shop staff to replace them with more a more turf friendly variety.

Cocktails and Insect Repellent

Both alcoholic drinks and insect repellent are toxic to turf. Please apply your bug spray on a cart path or off in the rough and leave your drinks off of the putting greens. Damage from these toxic elements can take weeks to recover and sometimes needs to be sodded which can leave a scar for months.

Use of the Wisp

At the edges of each green, there is a Wisp broom to use if you splash a lot of bunker sand up onto the green surface. Just use the Wisp like any other broom to brush the sand towards the edge of the green.

Fairways - Divot repair

When you take a divot, please just **put it back into the opening exactly the way it came out** and step on it with your foot. This approach to divot repair keeps our fairways looking clean and neat all day long. If your divot dries out and dies, one of our staff will remove it and add a seed/soil mixture to fill up the void.

Bunker Raking

When your ball lands in a bunker, always walk in from the low side bringing the rake with you and carefully rake your footprints smooth as you exit. Leave the rake at the low side of the bunker and please try to not pull any sand up onto the grass at the edge of the bunker.

Tee collection

Please pick up your tee after each tee shot and if broken put it into the small container for that purpose, if no container is present, just throw it off into the rough. Our staff regularly fills any divots created on tees.

Golf Cart Usage

Please drive at moderate speeds on all turf surfaces and be careful not to turn sharply creating damaging tire marks. Use all cart paths where provided and if the course is wet, drive on the high side of each hole and avoid any puddles.

Thanks for leaving the course as you find it!!
